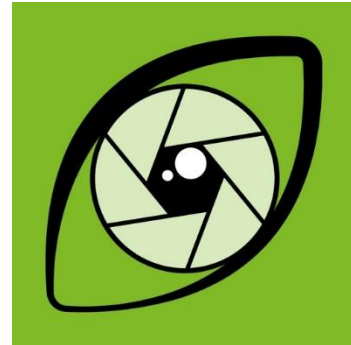


Instant Wild: Exploring endangered animals & conservation

Extinct

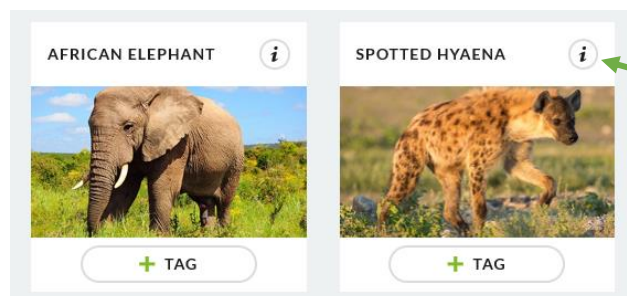
To protect wild animals and their habitats so they don't go extinct

3. For each animal you spot, click the *i* next to its picture to find out more about it.

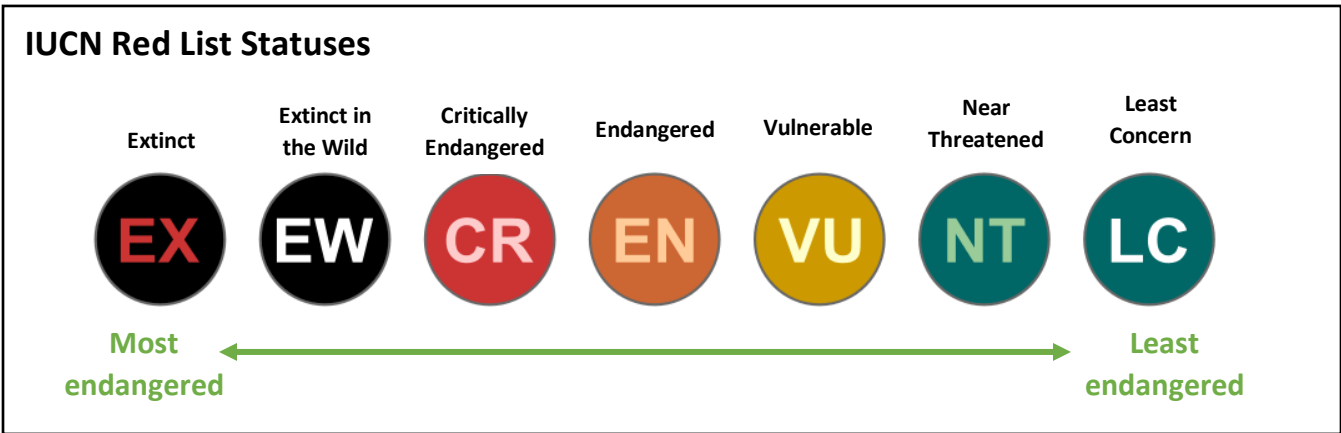


African Elephant ×

Above the picture it tells you the 'IUCN Red List Status' of the species – this is how endangered it is.

The African elephant is the largest living terrestrial animal. Their upper lip and nose form a trunk, which acts as a fifth limb, a sound amplifier and an important method of touch.
